8. Resurfacing of Walking Trail & Cemetery Roads – has 3 bids with Morgan Pavement being the lowest, bid includes a second seal but due to the weather may have to wait until spring to proceed. He will print off all bids and submit to office.

9. Resolution #11-01-2020 – Amendment to Budget Year 2020-21 – in order to accommodate monies budgeted for resurface bids we will need to amend the budget.

10. Curt Whiteford – P & Z Update – not any P & Z activity, but have been working on the code book with John Janson. Has all but 3 chapters completed to date. Council will discuss completed draft copy and continue with changes.

Doug Gardner is concerned about all the Russian olive trees in the community. Trees consume 75 gal water/day. Water is precious. Would like to see the town get involved in eliminating these trees. Council asks we contact Box Elder Weed Abatement, Steve Johnson, to see what they could help us with.

Council Member Reports:

11. Lesley Kendrick (Town) –current BECFD fee has been \$47/residential household. Wants to increase to \$60/residential household. This fee currently comes out of town general funds. To accommodate this increase taxes would have to be raised. Mayor wants council to think about it before the next general election where it would have to be on ballot.

12. Nate Spackman (Water) – water meter reader has had some health issues and hopes to be back in April to read meters. Nate will take care of this for now.

13. Jared Doman – (Park) – flagpole is done and beautiful. Keys to raise and lower will be kept in office. Shelby Braegger will be helping to install frisbee golf stations in the spring – possibility of removing the south ball diamond for better use.

14. Carolyn Taylor (Web) – added map to website.

15. April Litchford (Cemetery) – is there a possibility of keeping a better record of cemetery plots sold and which are available, has found a PDF map that could be embedded in website, would require a lot of work. Needs to have a more ethical way to keep these records current and in duplicate. Free range chickens (Mangum's) are causing a problem at the cemetery digging up weed guard and flowers. Town has put chicken wire on south side of cemetery.
