**New Business:**

4. Deputy Braegger Report – there was 17 calls from the town, nothing really concerning. There have been lots of fires around the county and encourages all to remember fire safety. Mayor Kendrick thanks his department and the highway patrol for their help with our July 4<sup>th</sup> celebration.
5. Mark Millett – did not attend – Mayor Kendrick informs council that he was coming to explain a new AM Emergency frequency for Box Elder County. This would allow communication if internet is down. It would be an app on mobile phones. More information later.
6. July 4<sup>th</sup> Review – other than running out of ketchup and mustard for the hotdogs it seemed to go well. Council Member Litchford suggests bottles of condiments kept on ice next year. It was suggested to involve food trucks for next year (donuts, cotton candy, snow cones). Council Member Wheatley suggested a frisbee golf or pickleball tournament or maybe a hotdog eating contest. Good comments on the chalk drawing event. Since there will be no Jon Thompson candy drop next year, Council Member Litchford suggests a candy

cannon. Mayor asks Council Member Doman when we the frisbee golf could be up and going? Still needs to purchase targets and cement the poles. The pickleball court needs anti-skid paint and striping. Mayor will check into paint.

7. Planning & Zoning Report – P & Z Chairman Curt Whiteford informs the council that our new engineering firm, Jones & Associates, has reviewed our latest revised copy of the Land Management Code Book. It was returned with many “red” areas of concern. A work meeting will be upcoming, the book will not be ready to vote and/or adopt by next month. New construction taking place on 10200 North. All have been approved by P & Z. Our zoning laws are easier right now until the new code book is in place. He suggested doing a survey of building costs in other communities. He also says we have no commercial zoning, but there has been suggestions to zone property west of railroad tracks as Ag40/Commercial.

8. Steve Marble Memorial -Mayor explains to members that because of time, she went ahead without consulting the council. Council says there are okay with the memorial that took place just before the meeting tonight.

### **Public Comments:**

Curt Whiteford suggests that we encourage floats to follow a theme at the next July 4<sup>th</sup> Celebration. Also maybe the Riser Tractor show on display at this time. The idea of having more picnic tables or mini bowery's would help too.

9. Approval of June 9, 2022 Town Council Meeting Minutes – Mayor points out a change in Item #11 where it talks about Shantelle Spackman arranging the veterans to walk in our parade. Should read Shantelle Spackman will find out about proper flag etiquette – whether a flag should be presented by walking at the beginning of a parade or if it can be mounted on a vehicle. Mayor Kendrick asks council member to contact her before contacting our town engineer or lawyer as costs are expensive.

7:40 PM MOTION: Council Member April Litchford made a motion to approve the minutes for June 9, 2022 with a change being made in Item #11. Council Member Jared Doman seconded the motion. Motion passes. Council Member Spackman did not vote as he was absent at last meeting.

Town will look into this further. Council Member Litchford says to be looking for cemetery help for the 2023 year. Post on web and marquee. Will also need grave digging help possibly by Misrasi Excavation next year as well.

15. April Litchford – Kristen is still working on the mapping for the cemetery. After finishing will consult with Janet Marble on records. Council Member Litchford will not be able to attend the next TC meeting.
