New Business:

4. Deputy Braegger Report – presented September 2022 report, nothing new to report. Deputy Braegger asks if the council has any questions for him. Council Member Wheatley voiced the opinion of many residents to see if the speed limit could be reduced. Deputy says it is a state road which is controlled by UDOT, but will try to have more deputies in the area to help with speed control.

4. (a) – Chairman Whiteford from the P & Z Commission told the council that Brad Burbank attended the last meeting with a change in Phase II of the Burbank Subdivision plat which had been previously verbally approved by the town council. The issue was tabled in order to do more research. Research has been completed and the Burbank’s have been advised on how to proceed.

There was a discussion on an AG 20 zone change and the 13 land owners involved had been invited by mail to attend the meeting. After the land owner's discussion, many had no desire to implement the change, so it will not be pursued in the future.

4. (b) – Justin Norr from the CBEFD announced that they have a fire engine in the making. Repairing paint, hoses, etc. and is looking for an engine either out of Cache Valley or Park Valley. Getting this vehicle up and running will make a difference in the future to resident's insurance. There are currently 6 members on the crew: Eric Anderson, Dale Marble, Justin Norr, Amanda Norr, Claine Smith, and Jody Reeder. If anyone knows of any more interested people in joining the team, contact them.

5. Cemetery Ordinance #2022-10 –An Ordinance to Maintain, Regulate and Control the Deweyville Cemetery. Council Members read through the ordinance and the questions that arose were discussed and answered.

7:32 PM MOTION: Council Member Wheatley made a motion to approved Ordinance 2022-10- The Regulation of Cemetery Procedures with the following changes: Section 2(a) add "or transferred" after the word sold; (f) add "or sale" after the word transfer in the first sentence and add "approval of the Mayor" in last sentence; Section 3(d) change "late" residence to "last residence and replace the word "friend" with "contact person"; 6(j) add to the end of sentence on metal detectors "except by town officials".

Water Conservancy Easement – The BRWCD License & Easement Agreement to pipe from the new well on Kliger property, through the upper paved road of the cemetery and joining the existing BRWCD pipeline. Agreement includes installation of pipeline, operation, maintenance, upgrade, replacement repair, protection, repair, etc. over and across the property. BRWCD compensation to the town is in the amount of \$21,760. Our town lawyer has reviewed the document and is in agreement.

Council Member Reports:

10. Lesley Kendrick – received some good legal council this past week; cannot stop anyone from putting a private road through their own property. Town lawyer and his partner would like to come and meet with P & Z Commission and review the Robert’s Rules of Order as to meeting conduct. Council Member Wheatley would like to know the cost of this before commitment. Mayor Kendrick will check with ULCT to see if they offer this service as well and costs. Mayor informs Council Member Spackman about the lead inspection of water pipe coming up. There is help out there to complete this. The BR Canal Company has received a grant to cement and cover many canals in coming years. Not sure if we will be involved. Mayor also asks Council Member Spackman for a current study of how many homes Deweyville well can support.

11. Nate Spackman – our well is back into normal range. In November will attend an online class to become a certified cross connection control program administrator.
12. Jared Doman – pickleball nets are still on backorder, will cancel this company and look into other options. Mayor has a contact name for getting court painted and will find a phone number.

13. Les Wheatley – asked about cameras for security. Ring is mostly residential but has contacted another company for his own business and will forward any information to Council Member Spackman. Attended a Mosquito Abatement Board Meeting last week and they report they have had more calls than ever before. There will be a public hearing next month for tax increase to help with spray expenses. Council Member Wheatley will attend some upcoming training for becoming certified with the Mosquito Abatement. Mayor asks him to put ordinances on the website.
14. April Litchford – nothing to report. Mayor asked her to blow grass from headstones. April would like to purchase an Eco blower for their use that will take the same battery as edgers. She will ask Bill Kam about sod to cover graves; will work on getting cement taken care of around filter, mayor says if cost is more than \$500 will need to bid.
