**New Business:**

4. Deputy Braegger Report – Total incidents according to chart provided was 13. Council Member Spackman asked about the traffic enforcement detail incident of 1. Deputy Braegger explained this was radar tracking for speeders. No further questions from council. Mayor expressed gratitude for their services.

5. BRWCD – Dave Forsgren – explained the upcoming study of pipelines in Deweyville, the goal being “lead free”. This will require the study of all water main lines, service lines, etc from meter to residential dwellings to determine type of pipe and size. Findings will be charted on a spreadsheet. This information will be available to the public at their request. Costs can be reimbursed. Keep track of all expenses and hours spent. Report completed by October 2024. Council Member Wheatley asked about the proposed tax increase for BRWCD. Meetings ongoing, no decision made at this time.

6. Tremonton City Council –Connie Archibald told the council that the Senior Center is available to those 60+ years. It is a place for seniors to have meals and social activities. The Tremonton City Council is asking for

support from neighboring communities for this service. Lyle Vance presented the financial aspect of meals on wheels for a 3-year average which is above and beyond what Tremonton City can afford. He asks the council to pay their proportionate share of Deweyville City users to help keep the program going. It was determined that only part of the residents shown on chart were actual Deweyville city residents. All 84309 zip code residents are not in the city limits.

Council Member Doman explains that our town has no business revenue coming in which makes the proportion amount difficult to be within our reach. Council Member Litchford also explains that the current Deweyville tax rate is very low. Mayor Kendrick said the council will take a serious look at this issue. This may have to be looked at monthly as to actual times used rather than a \$358 per person charge for one or two visits. This issue will again be discussed in a future town council meeting.

7. P & Z Report – Council Member Wheatley who was in attendance to the December P & Z Meeting reported that no new business was conducted, worked on the code book revision.

8. Fee Schedule – Mayor asked council to look at the current fee schedule, Resolution 05-22-03. Where do we need to increase fee amounts? Findings will be discussed after first of year.

**Council Member Reports:**

11. Lesley Kendrick – reports the Tree Lighting went well with many in attendance. Suggestion for next year is to build a fire in fireplace (Heward’s have taken on this duty). Appreciation Dinner for all workers will be in January, more information forthcoming.

12. Nate Spackman – well pump that was replace two years ago has a dead short. Glenn’s Electric will be coming to pull it and repair next week. Council Member Spackman met with Jones & Associates for the lead and copper update. They will help the town with costs. In the future, wells will be on GIS

mapping. Is working on the source protection update records. The Burbank/Wilcox water lines are being installed.

13. Jared Doman – talked to Stu Petersen about snow removal. Mr. Petersen will plow a pile of snow on parking lot rather than push gravel onto the grass. Mayor Kendrick reminds Jared that we can apply for another grant for a second pickleball court in January 2023.
14. Les Wheatley – reminds the town that the Get Healthy Utah Grant final impact reporting must be done by December 31, 2022. This will be final report on the impact the funding had on the community
15. April Litchford – work at the cemetery is finished for the season. A starter motor is still needed for the lawn mower and waiting for Misrasi Concrete to complete cement work on pump house box. The Bear River Canal Company will be removing all trees from the canal bank. Property owner Daren Yates has given his permission to dump the trees on his property. CBEFD will do a controlled burn to get rid of them in the spring.
